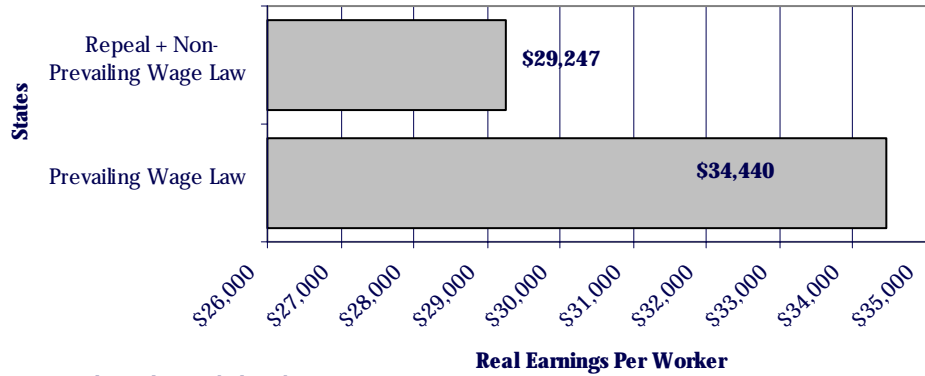

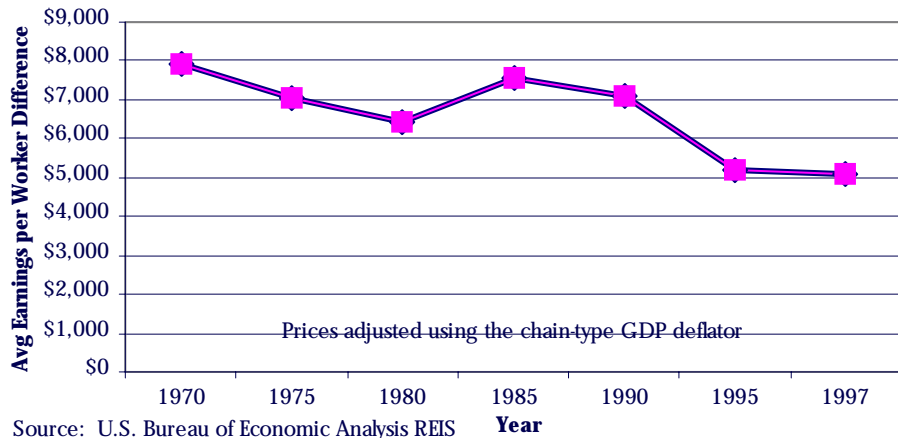

Prevailing Wage Law States, 1997



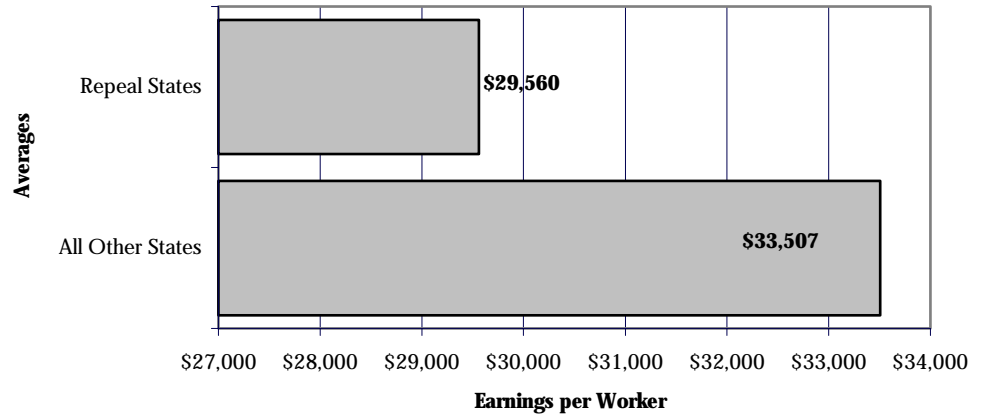

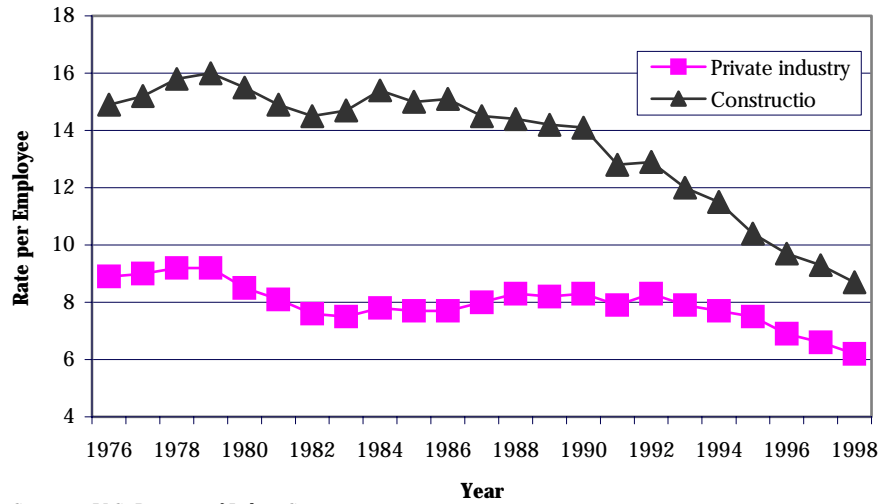

Average Earnings Per Construction Worker, Repeal versus All Other States, 1997



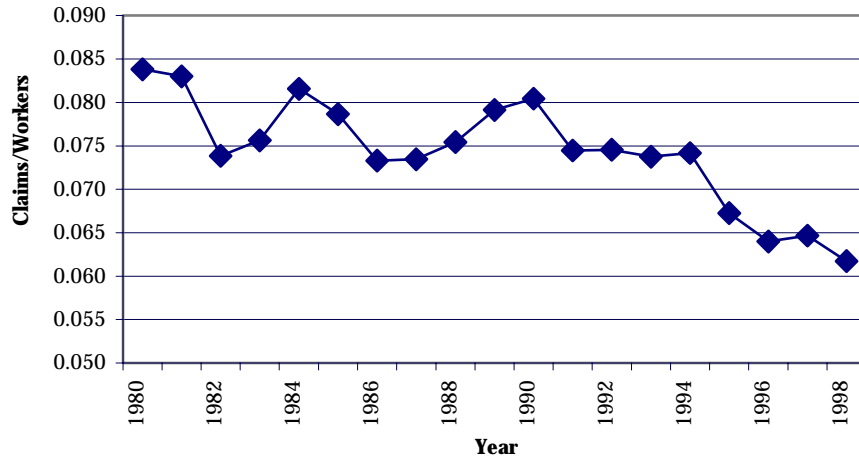

Total Nonfatal Injuries, for Construction and All Industries, 1976–1998



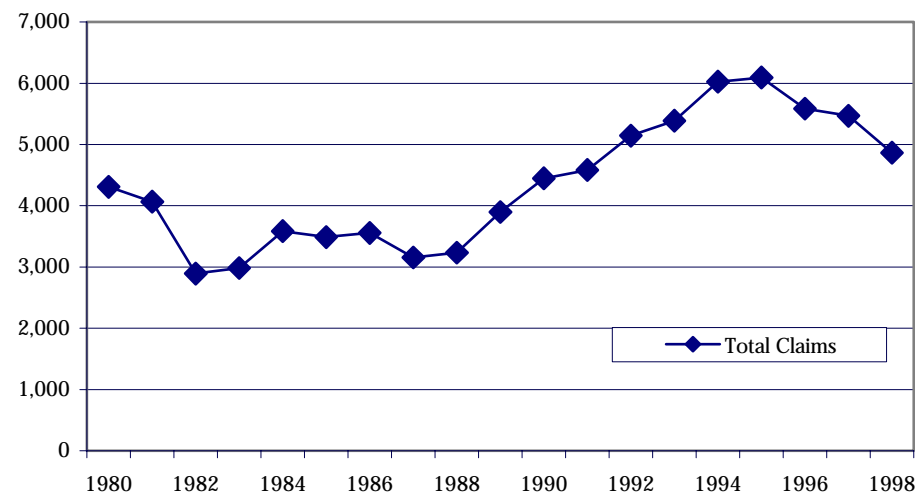

Worker's Compensation Claims, in All Industries, As a Percentage of Total Idaho Workers, 1980–1998



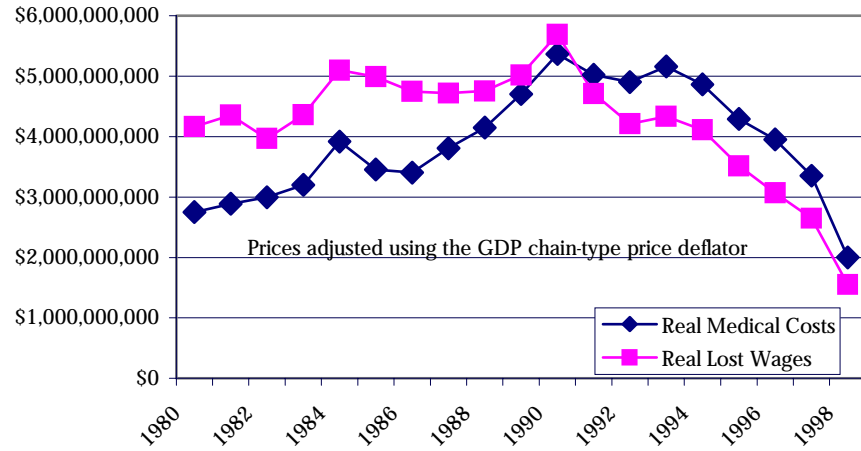
